

Wesley Financial Group, LLC Scholarship Program Official Rules

Void where prohibited by law. This Program is subject to all federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and ordinances.

By submitting an application, you agree to abide by and be subject to these Official Rules and the decisions of Wesley Financial Group, LLC (“Sponsor”), which shall be final and binding in all respects to this Scholarship Program.

The Wesley Financial Group, LLC Scholarship Program (“Scholarship” or “Scholarship Program”) will begin accepting applications from Thursday, June 25, 2020 at 12:00:01 a.m. Central Standard Time (“CST”) through Thursday, September 17, 2020 11:59:59 p.m. CST. Applications will not be accepted after that time. Sponsor’s computer is the official timekeeping device for this Scholarship Program.

1. Scholarship Program Overview

Sponsor has allocated and administered certain funds for the sole purpose of providing scholarship grants to eligible college and university students. The scholarships are designed to financially assist designated applicants who have lost a parent, are under financial strain, and are in need of financial assistance to fund their education. Recipients must be currently enrolled to complete an undergraduate degree at the college or university of their choice.

Sponsor will award five (5) scholarships each valued at Two-Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) USD (each being a “Scholarship Grant”).

2. Eligibility

Recipients of a Scholarship Grant must be at least eighteen (18) years of age or older at the time of the application deadline and be enrolled as an undergraduate student at a U.S. college or university while pursuing studies or conducting research to meet the requirements for an academic degree. Proof of age and enrollment at an accredited United States college or university is required. Each Scholarship Grant awarded hereunder must be used solely for tuition and related expenses at an accredited educational institution that maintains a regular faculty and curriculum and has an organized body of students. Sponsor reserves the right to impose additional, minor reasonable restrictions and/or requirements upon the awarding of Scholarship Grants.

Children or wards of employees, officers and trustees of Sponsor and their affiliates, agents, representatives, Program's advertising and promotion agencies, if any, as well as the children or wards of their household members, whether or not related, are not eligible to receive Scholarships as part of this Scholarship Program.

Applicants will not be discriminated against because of race, color, creed, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, national origin, disability, ancestry, marital status, veteran status, medical condition or any protected category prohibited by local, state or federal laws.

3. Application Process

Applicants must submit proof of current enrollment as well as an essay. The essay should include their program of choice, explain what type of career they would like to have in the future, and detail how the Scholarship Grant would help them to reach their goals. Applicant essays should be at least 500 words and no more than 1,000 words roughly.

Applicants are encouraged to explain in detail their level of need. Applicants who submit the most compelling essays will be chosen a recipient of a Scholarship Grant. The odds of winning are based on the number of eligible entries received. The winners will be notified by email and/or phone within 5 business days of selection. If a potential winner cannot be contacted as provided herein after two attempts, if they fail to sign and return any required documentation by the timeline as requested by the Sponsor, which shall in no event be later than Wednesday, September 30, 2020 or if a potential winner is disqualified for any reason, which decision shall be based on the Sponsor's sole discretion, the potential winner forfeits the Scholarship Grant.

4. Scholarship Selection Committee

Sponsor's Executive Team shall appoint all members of the selection committee charged with the evaluation of candidates for a Scholarship Grant.

Every member of any of Sponsor's selection committee charged with the evaluation of candidates for Scholarship Program shall be obligated to disclose any personal knowledge of and relationship with any potential grantee under consideration and to refrain from participation in the award process in a circumstance where he or she would derive, directly or indirectly, a private benefit if any potential grantee or grantees are selected over others.

A PARTICIPANT IS NOT A WINNER OF ANY SCHOLARSHIP GRANT UNLESS AND UNTIL PARTICIPANT'S ELIGIBILITY HAS BEEN VERIFIED AND PARTICIPANT HAS BEEN NOTIFIED THAT VERIFICATION IS COMPLETE.

5. Scholarship Program Renewals

Scholarship Grants will be awarded for a one-year period. Winners are not eligible for multiple awards.

6. Supervision of Scholarship Program

Unless otherwise provided in the fund agreement establishing a Scholarship, each Scholarship Grant shall be paid by Sponsor directly to the educational institution for the use of the scholarship recipient. A Scholarship Grant can be used only for: (1) tuition and fees required for the enrollment or attendance of the student at a qualifying institution; (2) fees, books, supplies, and equipment required for courses of instruction at such an educational institution; and (3) room and board. Sponsor will never disburse a Scholarship Grant and/or money directly to any winner; it will disburse scholarship funds only to applicable institutions.

7. Publicity Grant

Except where prohibited by law, participation in the Program constitutes each entrant's consent to Sponsor's (and its designees', successors' and assigns') use or distribution of entrant's name, biography, likeness, voice, photographs, video, opinions, statements, hometown, state and country of residence, college, town and state for promotional, advertising, research and other purposes (including in communicating with their college regarding entry and potential or actual receipt of scholarship funds) in any manner or media (including, without limitation, online, on websites and in social media), worldwide, in perpetuity, and without further payment, consideration, notice, review or consent.

8. Record Keeping Requirements

Sponsor shall retain the following records in connection with all Scholarship Grants: all information obtained by Sponsor to evaluate the qualifications of potential grantees, the identification of grantees, the purpose and amount of each grant, and any additional information Sponsor obtains in complying with its grants administration procedures. Information pertaining to unsuccessful applicants for awards shall be kept along with information on successful applicants.

Records pertaining to any grant made pursuant to this policy shall be kept for no less than three years after the filing of Sponsor's annual tax return for the period in which the last installment of such grant was paid.

9. Release of Liability

By participating, each entrant agrees to release, discharge, and hold harmless Sponsor (and advertising and promotion agencies), and the respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents, and representatives of the forgoing (collectively, "Released Parties") from any and all injuries, liability, losses, and damages of any kind to persons, including death, or property resulting, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, from student's participation in the Scholarship Program or any Scholarship Program-related activity or the acceptance, possession, use, or misuse of any awarded prize.

Persons who tamper with or abuse any aspect of the Scholarship Program, who act in an unsportsmanlike or disruptive manner, or who are in violation of these Official Rules, as solely determined by Sponsor, will be disqualified and all associated entries will be void. Should any portion of the Scholarship Program be, in Sponsor's sole opinion, compromised by non-authorized human intervention or other causes which, in the sole opinion of the Sponsor, corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness or proper play, or submission of entries, Sponsor reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to suspend, modify, or terminate the Scholarship Program and, if terminated, at its discretion, award the prizes from among all non-suspect, eligible entries received up to time of such action using the judging procedure outlined above or as otherwise deemed fair and appropriate by Sponsor. CAUTION: ANY ATTEMPT DELIBERATELY TO DAMAGE OR UNDERMINE THE LEGITIMATE OPERATION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM MAY BE IN VIOLATION OF CRIMINAL AND CIVIL LAWS AND SHOULD SUCH AN ATTEMPT BE MADE, SPONSOR RESERVES THE RIGHT TO SEEK DAMAGES AND OTHER REMEDIES (INCLUDING ATTORNEYS' FEES) FROM ANY SUCH INDIVIDUAL TO THE FULLEST EXTENT OF THE LAW, INCLUDING CRIMINAL PROSECUTION.

10. Disputes

Except where prohibited, each entrant agrees that: (1) any and all disputes, claims and causes of action arising out of or connected with this Scholarship Program or any prize awarded shall be resolved individually, without resort to any form of class action, and exclusively by the appropriate State or Federal Court located in Tennessee; (2) any and all claims, judgments and awards shall be limited to actual out-of-pocket costs incurred, including costs associated with entering this Scholarship Program, but in no event attorneys' fees; and (3) under no circumstances will entrant be permitted to obtain awards for, and entrant hereby waives all rights to claim, indirect, punitive, incidental and consequential damages and any other damages, other than for actual out-of-pocket expenses, and any and all rights to have damages multiplied or otherwise increased. All issues and questions concerning the construction, validity, interpretation and enforceability of these Official Rules, or the rights and obligations of the entrant and Sponsor in connection with the Scholarship Program, shall be governed by, and

construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Tennessee, without giving effect to any choice of law or conflict of law rules, which would cause the application of the laws of any jurisdiction other than the State of Tennessee.
